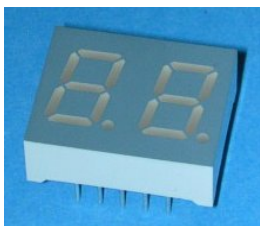


### Display ▪ Through-hole ELD-426SYGWA/S530-E2

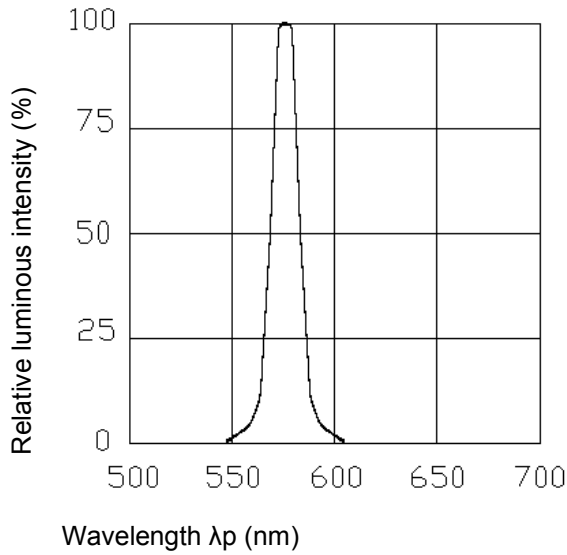

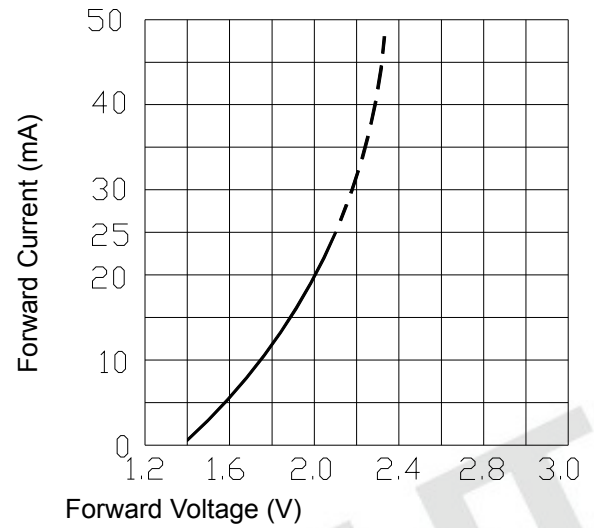

**Typical Electro-Optical Characteristics Curves**

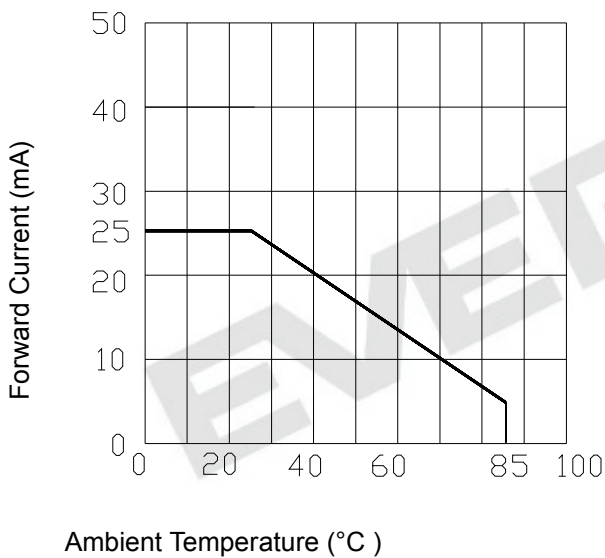
**Spectrum Distribution (Ta=25 °C)**



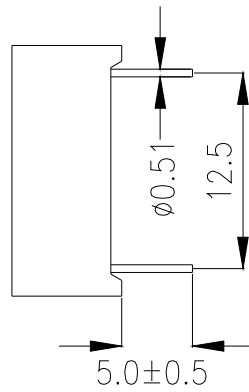
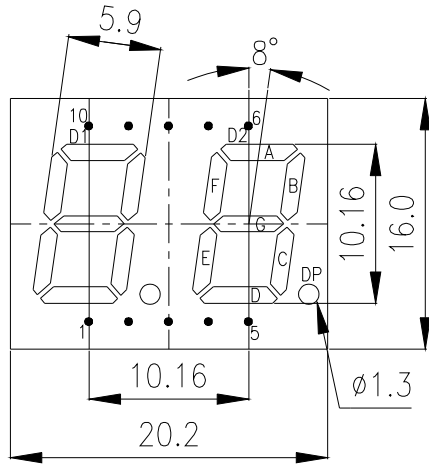
**Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage (Ta=25 °C)**



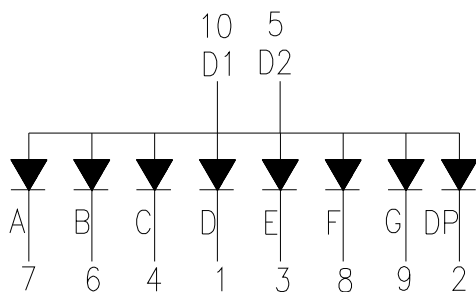
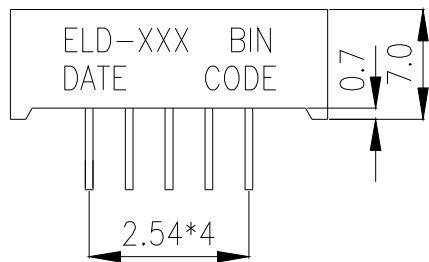
**Forward Current Derating Curve**



**Package Dimension & Internal Circuit Diagram**



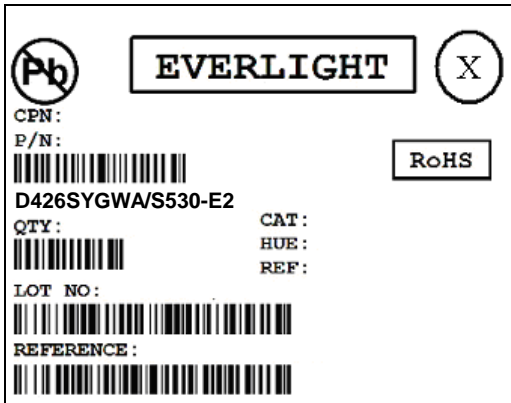

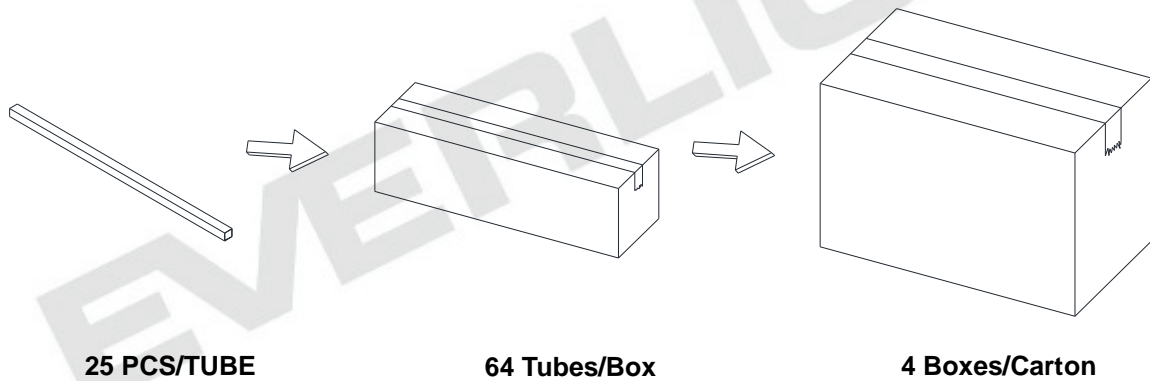

4. ESD (Electrostatic Discharge)

    - Eliminating the charge
      - Grounded wrist strap, ESD footwear, clothes, and floors
      - Grounded workstation equipment and tools
      - ESD table/shelf mat made of conductive materials
    - Proper grounding is required for all devices, equipment, and machinery used in product assembly. Surge protection should be considered when designing of commercial products.
